

ACTON BRIDGE & SANDON DOCK

Cruise the Weaver Navigation, Manchester Ship Canal, River Mersey and Liverpool Docks.

On the Weaver Navigation you will see

- Acton Swing Bridge (1934) which is is located on Acton Bridge island.
- **Dutton Locks** (1880) and the large flood control sluices.
- **Dutton Horse Bridge** a unique twin span greenheart timber bridge (1919).
- **Dutton Viaduct** (1836) which carries the West Coast main railway line.
- Frodsham cut now silted up led to the disused Frodsham Lock.
- Weston Canal which joined the Weaver Navigation to Weston Point Docks (Runcorn)
- **Sutton Weaver Swing Bridge** (1926), which carries the A56, adjacent to the Danny's Sutton Weaver berth.
- Frodsham railway viaduct (1850) and M56 viaduct (1970).
- Ineos Chemical Complex (formerly Rocksavage Works) but under redevelopment.
- Marsh lock (1895) provides access between the Weaver Navigation and the Manchester ship canal.

Along the Manchester Ship Canal (opened in 1894)

- Farmland and grassy salt marshes with great bird life with views of **Frodsham and Helsby Hills** to the south.
- **Stanlow Refinery** built in 1924 and now owned by Essar Energy has its own berths where ocean going tankers are quite likely to be seen.
- **Ellesmere Port** –National Waterways Museum and docks built by the Shropshire Union Railway and Canal Company, for whom the Danny was built in 1903.
- Mount Manisty named after canal engineer Edward Manisty
- **Eastham** before entering the locks we pass the "crane" or "sheer legs" berth where vessels proceeding to/from Manchester had to have tops of masts and funnels removed to do under the fixed bridges. The Danny uses the 80ft wide western lock into the Mersey.

Once in the Mersey we proceed down river using the Eastham Channel passing

- Queen Elizabeth Oil Dock with its 100ft wide lock handling tankers <40,000 tonnes.
- Eastham Ferry now two pubs woods and a country park
- views across the river to Garston Docks, Liverpool Airport and Hale Head.
- Rock Ferry tank cleaning jetty and slipway home to Royal Mersey Yacht Club.
- Tranmere Oil Terminal (1960) used by tankers up to 300,000 tonnes.
- Cammell Laird shipyard and dry docks where the Danny was built in 1903.
- Woodside Ferry terminal and U-boat (currently under renovation)
- Twelve Quays Ferry Terminal used by Stena Line Irish services
- Alfred Lock entrance to the Birkenhead dock system.
- Mersey Ferries' **Seacombe** landing stage

Looking across to the Liverpool side:

- The two cathedrals and St John's Beacon are visible inland
- and along the waterfront The M&S Bank Arena and Conference Centre, Royal Albert Dock complex, Canning river entrance, Museum of Liverpool, and the Dock Office, Cunard and Royal Liver Buildings.
- The Mersey ferry and Cruise terminals are in this area, with the new IOM Terminal slightly further down river.
- The new **Everton football stadium** at Bramley-Moore dock and **Anfield** on the sky-line.

According to tidal conditions and other traffic the **Danny** will go through either **Gladstone or Langton Locks** and pass through several docks and passages en route to her lay-up berth in **Sandon dock** where the cruise ends.
